Reception Home Learning: **Week 3**



Welcome to your child's home learning pack for the **week beginning 13th April.**

Here you will find a range of tasks that have been set by your child's class teacher to keep up with learning at home. We have given your child a book to record their learning progress. Happy learning!

Subject Area	Task to Complete
Phonics	<p>Recap phonic cards daily; write 5 different words, in home learning books.</p> <p>If you have access to a computer or tablet try to watch speed sound lessons on youtube-Ruth Miskin Training; via https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCo7fbLgY2oA_cFCIg9GdxtQ</p> <p>Select a Set 1 or Set 2 sound lesson to review. Live lessons will resume on Monday 20th April. (See phonics link see below*)</p> <p>Set 1- t, i, n ,p <u>or</u> set 2 oo, oo, ar, or (One a day is plenty)</p>
Reading	<p>Read a book of your choice together. Can you play I spy and spot words containing a sound you have been learning? (e.g. t, i, n ,p, oo, oo, ar, or). Try to read each day.</p>
Writing	<p>Can you write a sentence about your Easter weekend? Don't forget your finger spaces!</p> <p>Complete your handwriting book (if you have not already done so). Look at your own name? Do you have a middle name? Write your full name correctly formed – look at your handwriting books to check you are writing it correctly, follow carefully. Can you write it neatly in your home learning books? Can you write it in a 'rainbow of colours'?</p>
Mathematics	<p>Can you play a game where you take turns to count on</p>

	<p>the next three numbers from a given number? (E.g. you say 10, 11, 12 your child says 13, 14, 15)</p> <p>White Rose Home Learning – https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/early-years/</p> <p>Early Years Week 2 based on the story ‘What the Ladybird Heard’ The children are very familiar with this story as we have read it a few times in class activities. It looks good – enjoy! You could do a lesson and activity each day.</p>
Project Work	<p>Let’s look closely at ‘aeroplanes’ – do you know anything about aeroplanes or can you find out about aeroplanes? Can you draw one in your home learning books? If you could go on an aeroplane where would you go? Look at a world map or globe and write a list of a few places you would like to visit next on your aeroplane? Do you have any stories with aeroplanes in? We like Emma Jane’s Aeroplane by Katie Howarth. You could also log in to Espresso (see log in details below), search for ‘flying to school’. It shows a child’s journey to school on an aeroplane!</p>
Online Learning	<p>Purple Mash: (you should have been given a log in – if you need these details again then please email. admin@templemoor.trafford.sch.uk)</p> <p>To access Purple Mash: https://www.purplemash.com/sch/templemoor and then log in from here.</p> <p>Look on the ‘to do’ list and complete the task. Although you may do additional activities, the Maths games are good fun.</p> <p>Mathletics: Continue to work on tasks set but you can do more activities if you wish.</p> <p>Espresso: Have fun exploring the Foundation stage activities.</p>
Other tasks to complete	<p>Plant some seeds and keep a little diary each week to monitor the growth over time.</p> <p>Find out where the ingredients come from in the meals you are eating at home? Look at the labels of tins and packets. Do they tell you where they are from?</p>
